

FY '15 Church Read "The New Jim Crow" by Michelle Alexander

Pick up a copy of this important book at coffee hour. This Fall FPC will hold discussions about this book and what our society must do to reform prisons. Most MA leaders consider our prison system to be very broken. Of about 24,000 prisoners housed in MA, approximately half of them don't need to be there. MA recidivism rate is at our nation's rock bottom, only above Alabama. Read about America's penal system and necessary changes that would alter this expensive and unproductive system.

These workers, exploited by their employers, experience long hours (10 or more), few bathroom breaks, lack of safety rules, sexual harassment, intimidation to sign their rights away, and threats of deportation. UUSC and NAWJC conducted Know Your Rights seminars to encourage

leadership and organizing skills for workers. Together these partners have brought litigation against the companies that steal their workers' wages. To date, UUSC and NAWJC have recovered \$600,000 in back wages. Deplorable conduct of these companies has been exposed. A forthcoming report will highlight the industry's working conditions. A multimedia campaign for fundamental reform will follow the report, with the goal of bringing consumer pressure and the adoption of labor rights code of conduct for Arkansas and the nation. "In Memory Of Maya Angelou" Interning Grace by Intern Minister Tom Bozeman

In the days following Maya Angelou's death in May, much was written about her. Of all the posts flying around the Internet, though, one stuck out to me: an hour-long, televised conversation between Angelou and comedian Dave Chapelle (whose mother was a Unitarian Universalist minister). In the video (which can be found in four parts on youtube.com), Chapelle and Angelou have a wide-ranging discussion. Watching their conversation, I was moved to tears by both the beautiful intimacy of their conversation and the wonderful example it sets of intergenerational mentorship.

How often in our society do unrelated people with a fifty-year age gap communicate with one another so openly, honestly, intimately? One of the few places left where that can happen – where people are likely to interact with those of a different "demographic" – is in church.

So, as we look to decreasing our church involvement in July and August and as we venture out into the world, may we carry with us the value of interacting with those with whom we might not otherwise cross paths. May we help to knit together the fabric of society in ways unexpected and unanticipated.
