What a joy to be together again---welcome back, welcome home!!






OUR UU SOURCES: <u>The living tradition we share draws from many Sources:</u>

Interfaith Immigration Summit at Arlington Street Church, Sat Sept 27, 10:00 am to

4:00 pm sponsored by UU Mass Action, Boston New Sanctuary Movement & Alliance for Immigrant Justice. During '14 summer 60,000 unaccompanied children came to the USA seeking asylum. Our government has not recognized these children as refugees fleeing violence and imminent death. Six children are known to have been killed as a result of being deported back to Honduras. In order to advocate for the justice these children deserve, we must first educate ourselves. The Summit program will highlight a **panel discussion with immigration experts** and **personal stories told by newly arrived families** about being forced from their home country and the ordeal they are facing in the US. Stand up for Immigrant Children Rally was held at the Statehouse on August 9th. Marilyn Christmann, Sherry Gardner and Nancy Nowak marched and raised up our voices for Immigrant Children and Reform. We joined with dozens of UUs (lots from the South Shore and the Cape) and hundreds of other MA citizens in solidarity with immigrants. Together we Stood on the Side of Love. <u>SPIRITUAL ACTIVIST LEADERSHIP TRAINING</u> UU Mass Action, under the new dynamic leadership of Laura Wagner, reached its goal of raising \$5,000 through *Faithify*, a crowd funding process presented at General Assembly. The UU Funding Program is matching the \$5,000. Laura writes: "With this money we will be able to hire top notch educators for the SALT program, reserve adequate meeting space and make comfortable lodging arrangements. Best of all, we sent a loud and clear message to our young adults that we love and support them! Thank you for the generosity of your contributions." <u>The Mass Trust Act Victory</u> UUs have a lot to be proud of! On August 20th the Boston City Council voted unanimously to pass the Boston Trust Act! This came as a result of years of coalition building between Immigrant Rights groups and the interfaith community, including UU Mass Action. During the last several months the focus shifted from the statehouse to the <u>Boston City Council</u>. After passionate advocacy work and public hearings, the council members chose to stand on the side of love! This victory follows Cambridge and Somerville's decision to stop honoring ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement/DHS) holds on undocumented immigrants not accused of a crime. The Hampden County sheriff also ordered the county to stop honoring ICE holds. UUs— savor this victory before we renew our efforts for a statewide end of ICE holds. Unitarian Universalist Service Committee News

President Barack Obama signed the <u>Assessing Progress in Haiti Act</u> into law on August 8. This law will bolster oversight of transparency, accountability, democracy, and good governance for US aid to Haiti and also increase awareness of the needs of vulnerable populations. Congress calls for the Secretary of State to coordinate a three year strategy to address priority constraints and report annually to Congress. UUSC staff and volunteers have worked tirelessly for years since the 2010 earthquake to get this law through Congress. A Huge Success! Visit <u>UUSC.org</u>

UUSC and UUA, along with the UU-United Nations Office, are ardently supporting the **People's Climate Change March in NYC** on Sept 21.

UUSC and UUA Presidents and activists wrote to the Mayor of Detroit about the Right to Water and the injustice of the **water shutoff crisis this summer**.

IF YOU HAVE NOT YET MADE YOUR PLEDGE, COULD YOU DO SO?


