From the Governing Board: The President's Report

At our November meeting, the Governing Board voted to approve \$212,000 for the front step renovation project as recommended by the Capital Projects Planning group. The funds to pay for the project will come from Meeting House trust fund reserves as recommended by the Trustees. We decided to re-schedule the committee chair meeting (the one that was cancelled because of power outages associated with the recent storm) to Wednesday January 26th at 7 pm on Zoom. Details to follow in January.

The monthly 'Talk with the Governing Board' session will take place on December12th after church. Sunday Morning Liaison Sally Delisa and I will be available for questions after church both in-person and by Zoom. And, of course, you can always reach out to any board member at any time with questions or concerns.

We also finalized our goals for the 2021-2022 church year. These are listed below:

2021-2022 Governing Board Goals

- Facilitate community in the church
 - o Support Fun Friday, book clubs, and other events
 - o Attend church-wide events and fundraisers
 - o Attend coffee hour
- Communication and transparency; to the congregation and to committees
 - o The President will write a Governing Board report for each Bell Ringer
 - o Update and distribute the org. chart of board members and chairs/co-chairs
 - o Make the bylaws and annual meeting minutes easily available to members
 - o Run three co-chair meetings
 - o Continue the 'Meet with the Board' at coffee hour
 - o Liaisons should attend one each of their groups' meetings
- Support the DARI initiative
 - Organize a church-wide vote (completed)
 - Support the Parsonage working group
- Set in place a process for a long-term plan for church finances;
 - o Create a working group to create a five-year plan
 - o Consider whether a similar plan for growth/survival is required
- Fundraising
 - Propose / support alternatives if Covid prevents the Holiday Fair, the Service Auction, and Summer Fair from taking place (or from being as successful as hoped)
- Support Envisioning the Sanctuary initiative
 - o Help the committee organize a special meeting to vote on options
 - Propose and/or support solutions
- Support social justice/green initiatives
 - o Make all Governing Board voting decisions through a 'green' lens


