From the Governing Board: The President's Report

At the December Governing Board meeting, we heard updates on DARI (the Duxbury Afghani Resettlement Initiative) and learned that a family had arrived and is now in the parsonage. Congratulations to all who are making this initiative a reality!

Related to the parsonage, the Governing Board voted to approve spending to replace the heating system. We also discussed the de-leading certification that had occurred many years back. Pursuant to that, the Governing Board will schedule an additional inspection because the paperwork for the prior inspection cannot be located.

In other developments:

- Governing Board member Mark Schlesinger (the Outreach liaison) is stepping down from the board. We thank Mark for his work on the board and wish him the best. The Governing Board will be working with the Nominating committee to find a replacement. In the meantime, chairs from the Outreach committees (Social Justice, Welcoming Congregation, Partner Church, and Communications) should reach out to me with any questions or concerns.
- Upon the recommendation of the Religious Education and Nominating committees we voted to add Regina McKinney to the Religious Education committee.
- The Governing Board received an update from past President Mary Flanagan who has been gathering materials from committees for a Policies and Procedures manual. If your committee has not submitted materials for this effort, you will likely be hearing from Mary or your Governing Board liaison about this. Please respond as soon as possible.
- The proceeds from December's Holiday Fair have now exceeded \$7,000! Many thanks to all of the volunteers and to everyone who donated items for the fair. It was a true community effort and we are deeply grateful.
- Following the Christmas Eve service I heard from several church members who expressed grave concerns that the performance by the Snug Harbor chorus did not follow our own Safe Congregations Covid protocols. The Governing Board will follow up with the Worship/Music and Safe Congregations committees to assure that such breaches do not occur again.
- The monthly 'Talk with the Governing Board' session will take place on January 23rd. Vice President Cindy Ladd Fiorini and Treasurer Karl Schweitzer will be available for questions after church both in-person and by Zoom. And, of course, you can always reach out to any board member at any time with questions or concerns.
- Keep an eye out for the committee chair meeting scheduled for Wednesday January 26th at 7 pm on Zoom. Details to follow soon.

Become Pen Pals With An Incarcerated Person

UU Mass Action recently introduced a pen pal program with the MA Department of Corrections. I signed up and am finding the experience very rewarding.

My pen pal responded almost immediately to my first letter. She is 59 and single, had a baby at 15, was incarcerated at 17, made parole at 42 but returned to prison at 48 for associating with an "ex-con" (her quotation marks). She has taken every possible program available to her at MCI Framingham and is a trainer for the Guide Dog Foundation. She enclosed a photo of the adorable 8-week old white lab she is currently training.

They are looking for more pen pals and I hope you will sign up. You determine the frequency with which you communicate, so it need not be burdensome. 
