# Governing Board

## **From the Governing Board: The President's Report**

This is my last Bell Ringer article as Governing Board President. My term ends when Cindy Ladd Fiorini is elected as our next President at the upcoming annual Program meeting. It has been an honor to serve as President. As I go off the Governing Board, so do the following board members: Karl Schweitzer (Treasurer), Sally Delisa (Sunday Morning Liaison), and Lester Lloyd (Physical Plant Liaison). I'd like to take this opportunity to thank them for all the work they do for the church.

Items discussed at the Governing Board May meeting included:

- **Warrant for the June program meeting:** We assured that the warrant for the June program meeting was posted at least two weeks in advance as required by our bylaws. The bulk of the work for that meeting, it should be noted, is being done by the Nominating committee, which puts together the slate of nominees to be elected to serve on various committees. I also encourage everyone to read the meeting packet, which includes reports from the wide range of committees doing the work of the congregation.
- **Welcoming Congregation to move into the Social Justice Committee:** The Welcoming Congregation committee has decided that the timing is right to fold their activities into the Social Justice Committee. The Social Justice Committee agrees with this plan. The next time our bylaws are updated we will need to amend them to reflect this change.
- **Parsonage update:** The Afghan family continues to do well. You may have noticed the recently-added, fenced-in play area to the side of the parsonage. Our commitment to offer them housing extends through June of 2023. The family will ultimately move to other housing. The DARI (Duxbury Afghan Resettlement Initiative) group is working now on plans to make that a smooth transition.
- **The front steps:** As mentioned in my last Bell Ringer article, the work on the front steps will take place over the summer. For this reason we are not scheduling any weddings, but memorial services will proceed with the expectation that mourners will enter from the back.
- **Envisioning:** See elsewhere in the Bell Ringer for an update.
- **Summer Fair:** If you have not already signed up to help, please do so now. We need all hands on deck for this important fundraiser.
- **Our budget deficit:** Our Treasurer's projection of our deficit exceeds our budgeted amount. If you have not yet paid your pledge for the 2021-2022 church year, please do so soon. And if you haven't made a pledge yet for the 2022-2023 church year, we could really use it.
- **Mark your calendars for Religious Education Sunday:** Sunday June 12th is Religious Education Sunday. It has been a true joy having our young people in the sanctuary at the beginning of each worship service. RE Sunday is a chance to acknowledge them as well as the staff and volunteers who make it all possible.
- **Land acknowledgement statement:** Our Social Justice committee continues to do important work on a land acknowledgement statement. You will be hearing more about that in the fall.

### **The Envisioning Work Continues**

The result of the voting on the three motions at the May 1<sup>st</sup> special meeting means that our historic tablets will be moved from their current position to the choir loft and the wording on the crown molding above the pulpit will be covered while we consider new wording or symbolism. In addition, members voted to support the work of the Envisioning the Meeting House in the 21st Century working group moving forward.

In the short term, the work of the committee now moves to the logistics of moving the tablets and covering the text on the crown molding. We expect that the tablets will come down and the text will be covered sometime this summer. Longer term, the working group will look at what will go in place of the tablets and the wording on the crown molding, but it will also consider broader issues, including use of technology in the sanctuary and making our church experience more family friendly.

## **First Parish Church Unitarian Universalist** **Land Acknowledgement Principle, Practice, Process**

### **Principle:**

Land acknowledgement is a custom dating back centuries in native nations and communities. Today land acknowledgements are used by many populations to recognize indigenous peoples whose ancestral lands we now inhabit. We do so before public events and other important gatherings.

### **Practice & Process:**

A subcommittee of the Social, Racial, Environmental Justice Committee will craft a brief land acknowledgement to introduce services and public events, and a more detailed statement about why we do this. Both statements will be included in a Justice Committee Pamphlet for the pews.

We will continue to discuss this principle and practice with the congregation in anticipation of eventually bringing the practice to a vote.

### **Statement Drafts May 2022:**

#### **Short:**

We, members of First Parish Church of Duxbury, acknowledge that we occupy the ancestral and unceded lands of the Wampanoag. We confirm that we have largely neglected and misunderstood their experiences. We commit to support their efforts to regain and maintain their self-determination.

#### **Fuller:**

First Parish Church acknowledges that we are on the land once inhabited by the Wampanoag.

We are committed to honoring the sovereignty of indigenous peoples who lost their lands and their means of livelihood due to disease, war, broken treaties, massacres, forced removals, enslavement and forced assimilation. We recognize their painful history caused by European settlement.

We believe that indigenous peoples should be given reparations by the United States government and should be protected by law from further loss of land and from the termination of agreements that they hold to be beneficial.

### **Herring Pond Wampanoag Tribe**

The Herring Pond Wampanoag have continuously occupied for thousands of years the land of what is now the Cedarville Region of Plymouth and has never ceded its lands by sale or treaty.

Their land rights now include their cemeteries, their Dina Path property, a 6 acre parcel deeded to them in 2019 by the town of Plymouth, and their Pondville Meetinghouse, located in Cedarville, adjacent to Herring Pond. Built in 1838 it is the focus of their existence.

They declare that they live in the heart of the long history of colonization and appropriation of indigenous lands. They say "we are not a conquered people, we are a resilient and determined people, well aware of our history and committed to preserving our tribal rights in the future."




## **Black Lives Matter: What Our Faith Calls Us to Do**



Fairs have been part of First Parish Church history as early as 1839 according to a letter written to Elizabeth Bradford in Boston by her sister Lucia Alden Bradford on May 2, 1839. “I went to Mrs. Hathaway’s last Monday evening to the monthly antislavery meeting.... and we talked some about sending our fair things to Boston.”

Many fairs are mentioned in memoirs and letters throughout the history of FPC. According to Elizabeth S. Peterson in her “Earlier Days of the First Parish, Duxbury: Fact and Fancy” (1890-1920), “Practical hand-maidens of the Lord, in the 1890s, were the women of the Unitarian Sewing Circle and of the Alliance, its successor after 1906.” “Money was raised by large biennial summer fairs, of two days duration. These were held at Academy Hall or Duxbury Hall or Mattakeesett before we acquired the Washington Street Parish House. Each year the Sewing Circle ran a Halloween Party, a Christmas sale, Valentine or Washington Birthday party, a May party and sometimes in June, a strawberry festival. The Almanac had to be studied to plan these “on the moon”, as there were no street lights and hand-lanterns gave poor illumination for the rough sidewalks and roads.”

The Annual Report of the Unitarian Sewing Circle from October 1900-August 1901 gives us a detailed and interesting account of the 1901 Summer Fair. “The fair for which we all worked during the year was held in Mattakeesett Hall, Aug 8th and 9th, and was a great success. The hall was prettily decorated for the occasion. Supper being served in the basement.” The Annual report names the women responsible for each table as well as its location. There were tables for souvenirs, fancy and useful articles, (towels, tablecloths, pillow slips, bed quilts, collars, socks, aprons, pottery), a remembrance table, grabs, articles for children, and food, ice cream, candy, and lemonade. “The gross receipts of all this was \$511.33, Expenses \$60.89, Net \$450.44.” The final words of the Report, “After the fair we adjourned until the 1st Wednesday in October.”


**Only 31 Days Until Fisherman's Services Begin Again!**
