## From the Governing Board: The President's Report

Happy November! October was a busy month at First Parish Church. I believe the highlight of my month was leading the New to UU luncheon in Catherine's absence. It was so lovely to see new, interested people who are seeking a church community. Community is really one of the things we do best! Thank you to Joy Sawyer, Kathy Bray and the membership committee for putting a great event together.

Our Governing Board meeting was missing a few members last Thursday including Rev. Catherine who was in Australia helping to deal with a family emergency and our Clerk, Regina Mortland, whose 100 year old mother had died after a full and long life, and according to Regina, "on her own terms." Our condolences to you Regina.

The Governing Board meeting covered a myriad of topics from looking into consolidating a couple of committees (Systems and Information Technology and Communications), pursuing our need to have monthly all-financial meetings and appointing a committee to oversee our insurance needs. We also visited the subject of the ministerial transition and continued a discussion of a one versus a two year interim minister. I will be contacting the Office of Ministerial Transitions at the UUA. Right now the person I need to talk to is out on a half sabbatical due to return in mid November, so sit tight and stay tuned. As I have said before, there is not too much we can do until after the first of the year, and really until much later than that, in May. But we will have informational meetings and opportunities starting in January.

Our Black Lives Matter banner preceded the organization, but it is worth a look and perhaps a future wording decision. We will update you as we learn more.

Lastly we started a discussion about strengthening Denominational ties - both with the UUA and the New England region. One thing we would like to talk about and get some enthusiasm going about is having a group of people from our church attend the UUA General Assembly this year which is in Pittsburgh. **Envisioning Update** 

The Envisioning the Meeting House in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century working group is continuing its efforts in three broad areas:

- 1. *Family friendliness*: We are looking into creating child-friendly/breast-feeding-motherfriendly spaces in the sanctuary and are exploring possibilities with the Religious Education committee. It is interesting to see how the current wheelchair-accessible spaces in the sanctuary are attractive to families because of the added space they offer and the carpeted floor that children can play on.
- 2. *The vestibule*: The vestibule is dark and uninviting. Some of the current furniture needs to be rethought/removed. Improved lighting could make a big difference as could some welcoming materials and a revamped historical exhibit. The Historical Committee is actively looking at this and we are also seeking the Membership Committee's input.
- 3. Protection for the tablets: We are exploring a simple solution to protect the historic tablets in the choir loft. Our main concern is the traffic from workers accessing the cell tower equipment in the steeple. Our plan is to create a fabric protector to be hung in place when we know there will be cell tower activity. A movable Lexan/Plexiglas protector could serve the same purpose, but right now we believe that the simplest solution is to use fabric. We have measurements for such a protector but are seeking input on how best to create it. We are looking for volunteers in the congregation who are experienced with sewing and fabrics. Please contact Jim Hamilton (jim@greenharbor.com, 781-724-6456) if you can help.

We also know that technology use is looming issue, particularly related to: (1) concerns about sound/hearing and (2) how to integrate video technology into the sanctuary. However in the short term, the working group is focusing on the three issues mentioned above.

## Join the Banned Books Book Club!

We are seeing a rapid acceleration of book censorship occurring across the US. More than 2,500 different book bans have taken place over the past year, according to the American Library Association.

**Book Club Overview:** Over this church year we will read and discuss books that are frequent targets of censorship. We will meet in Nov, Jan, Mar and May.

- Pick the meeting time that fits for you daytime in-person or evening via Zoom.
- Pick a book that appeals to you. For each topic there will be at least 3 selections to pick from. Read one or all.
- Open to the community, invite friends and family!

## First meeting Wednesday, November 16. Pick your meeting time:

In November we will discuss books related to gender, books which have been the most frequently challenged of the past 2 years.

For the first meeting read one or more of the following:

**Beyond Magenta: Transgender Teens Speak Out** by Susan Kuklin. The author interviews six transgender or gender-neutral young adults, and includes photographs, helping us understand the emotional and physical journey each youth has taken.

*Melissa* by Alex Gino. (Previously published as *George*.) This short novel is aimed at middle graders. When people look at Melissa, they think they see a boy named George. But she knows she's a girl. "Timely, touching... *George* may be the most right-now book imaginable." -- *New York Times Book Review* 

*Gender Queer* by Maia Kobabe. This memoir about being gender nonbinary is in graphic novel form.

Your Partner Church Committee announces that after almost 20 years of service as minister of our Partner Church in Nyaradszerada, Transylvania, the Reverend Szilard Sandor has moved on to take a similar position in a different parish. The committee has been aware since March 2022 that Szilard would be leaving our partner church ministry in the summer or fall of this year. He and his family have moved now to a home near his new congregation in a nearby area. Szilard's wife, Eva, will continue to teach at the same school. We have enjoyed a long relationship with Szilard and wish him and his family well. One of Szilard's major accomplishments during his ministry was overseeing the construction of the new church on the Nyaradszereda town square-- a project to which we at First Parish contributed significantly.

We remain in touch with our Nyaradszerada partners through a leader of their congregation, our English-speaking friend, Lorant. As we here at First Parish expect a similar series of changes in the coming year, we'll continue to nurture our longstanding relationship with our fellow Unitarians in Transylvania.

# PLEDGING

## PLEDGE UPDATE COMING IN THE MAIL!

All First Parish members and friends who have pledged will receive an update in the mail within the next few weeks. This is the pledge made for our current fiscal year (FY23) in response to the stewardship drive last spring. Many people like to be reminded of their pledge amount and where they stand at this time of year. As you may recall, our fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30<sup>th</sup> and so the total amount of your FY23 pledge is not due until next June. We will also send out a 2022 tax statements in late January listing your contributions.

As was reported at the annual finance meeting, our pledge numbers are down considerably. Currently, we have 97 pledges for a total of \$160,679. This represents about a 10% decrease in number of pledges and in dollar amount compared to last year. If you have not made a pledge for this year and would like to – it is not too late! As a reminder, we can help arrange for automatic deductions using a bank account or credit card. Many people choose to make monthly donations and consider it one less thing to worry about.
