From the Governing Board: The President's Report

Our last meeting on December 15th was held via zoom due to the uptick in infections.

We voted to have the Capital Projects Committee go forward with a fix to our boiler valves to the amount of \$2550.00 from Cell Capital Funds.

We are continuing to work on the issue of the sound system in the sanctuary. A different type of hand held microphone is being researched. Additionally, Ted Lillys will be training our sexton Damian and another yet to be named person to handle the sound board during services starting in January.

We heard that the theme for this year's fund drive will be "We Have a Good Thing Going" and that fund drive will officially start in March, although anyone wanting to pledge before then, or to change their pledge can contact either Mary Flanagan or Pat Slechta. Importantly we thanked RE and Membership for their roles in the December Holiday workshop and to RE for their successful Thanksgiving feast! We also thanked all the chairs, especially the BIG CHAIR, Jim Hamilton for a really successful Holiday Fair. Thank you again!

As to opportunities going forward I know that the ministerial transition is on many minds. You will all have the opportunity to hear more about it from Rev. Keith Kron of the Ministerial Transition Office of the UUA on Sunday January 22 when he will conduct the service for us. He will also be available during coffee hour for conversation. For all of you who are chairs or vice chairs of committees or task forces, Rev. Kron will be joining us at our second all committee chair meeting, which is primarily a social meeting, at noon at Cedar Hill. Please let your liaisons know if you can attend. Lunch will be served. More information elsewhere in Bell-Ringer.

Also coming up this winter will be ongoing discussions on the Article 2 Study Commission work. According to the UUA website:

Article II of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) Bylaws, Principles and Purposes, is the foundation for all of the work of our UUA and its member congregations and covenanted communities. It is the covenant to which all of our congregations and covenanted communities pledge themselves when they become members of our UUA.

Work is being done at the UUA on our Principles and Purposes and we want out voice to be heard. Catherine preached on this topic in December and this will be the ongoing opportunity for discussion. Stay tuned

Lastly for now, we are supporting the Growth Team initiative for the Banned Book Club, with the topics of Holocaust denial and antisemitism being explored. Please see specifics elsewhere in Bell-Ringer.

I hope you all had a wonderful winter break filled with meaningful time spent with family and friends. Thanks to all who participated in our first Multigenerational Holiday Pageant – it was great way to kick off the holidays.



Who knew that dinosaurs were still around to witness the birth of Jesus!

This month our church-wide theme is about *Finding our Center*. But what does that mean? When we think about being "centered" we often imagine taking a pause or making time for rest or stillness. We may find out center in meditation, or interacting with nature, reading poetry or praying. And yet, helping us find peace and calm is not the only work found on the path of finding our center. This month the folx at *Soul Matters* suggest that "being a "centered person" often involves the opposite of keeping things calm. It's not simply a place of peace and calm; it's also a place of being pushed and launched. What you hear in this deep space within is not just the whisper of "Rest" and "Breathe," but also "Take a deep breath and jump!" We encounter an invitation there, not just relaxation. It's a still point, yes. But a still point upon which we pivot and turn to something new."

So this month in RE, we'll be learning about and exploring our center by returning to our Principles (or Children's Promises) to find stillness & calm as well as to push us to learn new things about our place in the world, and what our UU faith calls us to do.

How about you? Where are you after these last few years of tumult? I wonder "Where is your center sending you these days?" and "Where is your center calling you to go?"



Cell Fund Grants Available

First Parish Church receives income from telecommunications companies that lease space in the church. A portion of these funds is available to support programs in communications, enrichment of church life, information systems and technology, and leadership development. Committees, members, and friends may <u>apply for grants</u>. Youth applicants must apply through the Religious Education Committee. The Cell Program Grant Committee meets the first Sunday of the month, excluding July and August. Grant applications (other than social justice grants) should be submitted two weeks prior for review.

All cell grants must reflect UU principles and values and/or advance the mission and goals of First Parish Church. Grants may be used to create a new program or support an ongoing program within the church, and applicants should identify ways to measure success.


