Meanwhile, in August 2021, at the annual retreat of your First Parish Governing Board, a motion was passed to seek approval of the congregation to house an Afghan refugee family at the church parsonage. *A few weeks later, the congregation (YOU!) voted to house an Afghan family until June 2023.*

Outreach to the Duxbury community led to donations of everything needed to house a family. A Go-Fund Me raised nearly \$50,000. We waited and waited and then, late one Thursday night, we were told that a family of five kids (with one on the way) was landing at Logan on Monday---and they were ours!

Over the past year we on DARI (Duxbury Afghan Resettlement Initiative) have fallen on love with our amazing family! *We have also come to realize that, although our family has made great strides in acclimating to their new home, they are not ready to strike out on their own.* Our fondest wish for them is an independent life—**that is not quite possible yet.** The family has made such progress over the past six months –the parents' English has made a break though, Maruf has gotten a second job, Zia is looking forward to working at home as a seamstress, lots of medical and dental issues they brought with them have been resolved.

Your Governing Board is giving serious consideration to extending the stay of the family in our parsonage to June 2024. *Those of us who have been working with the family believe that they will be quite prepared for independence by that time!*

# Governing Board

## Monthly President's Report

January has been a busy month here at First Parish especially as we prepare to make preparations for interim or transition ministry. We are also continuing to support the family from Afghanistan both by offering our parsonage but also in the number of volunteer hours that members of First Parish Church give to this family. I'll talk about these a little more in a moment.

We also have fundraising going on - Don't Miss the Service Auction on February 4! It will be fun AND delicious. If you can't attend, check out the ability to bid online (noted elsewhere in this Bell-Ringer.)

The Historical Committee is looking closely at our vestibule to see if we can make it more visitor - and member - friendly. Go take a look at it yourself. The number one priority out there at the moment is new lighting and keeping it clean and dusted!

Tracy and I met with representatives of the Finance groups and people in the church to begin to brainstorm how to streamline our processes and how to budget for the future. We want to make sure everyone is on the same page, has the same numbers and understands how all the elements work together. We will be meeting monthly for the foreseeable future. Anyone is welcome to attend if they want to observe the process.

OK. TRANSITION. This past Sunday we were pleased to welcome Rev. Keith Kron to our pulpit and to our annual Cedar Hill all-chair meeting. Rev. Kron is the head of the Ministerial Transition office at the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA). He was very thought-provoking in his sermon, helping us open our minds to new possibilities. It will be difficult to say goodbye to Catherine AND to the way the church has been the last 19 years with Catherine as our minister. The two things go hand in hand. At the all-chair meeting he presented an argument for a two year versus a one year interim hire. I think the bottom line is - do it well the first time so we don't have to re-do it after a few years because we weren't really ready. Many of us, myself included, who went in thinking just one year was enough for us, left being converted to a two year interim. I see it as an exciting challenge and time of discernment. We are a healthy vibrant community and it is up to us to maintain that.

Rev Kron also talked us through the process for the upcoming spring and it is as follows:

1. Early February we will be talking to all of you about the one year versus two year interim. I would like to hear from you about your thoughts, as would Tracy and the rest of the board. Tracy Wagner and Ted Lillys will be available specifically after church next Sunday to talk to you. I am always a phone call, text or email away. [claddfiorini@gmail.com](mailto:claddfiorini@gmail.com) or 617-921-6224. The other members of the board are Regina Mortland, Pat Slechta, Jay Bray, Donna Savicki, Emily Simeone and Nancy Landgren.

2. At our February Governing Board meeting on the 16th we will be voting on an Interim Ministry Search Committee. The committee will be a subgroup of the Governing Board. We will also vote on whether to pursue a two year or one year interim ministry.
3. There are some forms to fill out. There is a search packet to put together, all before the middle of April. Meanwhile prospective interim ministers are informing the UUA that they are interested in an interim next year.
4. In the beginning of May the searchers and searchees names are put together at the UUA and we are then given 6-8 names of potential interim ministers for the search committee to consider, interview and check references on. A decision in the form of a ranking of yeses and nos is returned to the UUA by the middle of May. It is a very condensed process. At the same time the potential interim ministers are ranking us!
5. We should know by the end of May if all goes according to plan!!

DARI - We are considering offering our parsonage to the Afghan family for an additional year. The family has made considerable progress since they arrived the beginning of December 2021 but they are not yet ready to live more independently. We will have an after church conversation on February 5th but again please feel free to contact me, Tracy or Catherine with any questions and/or concerns.

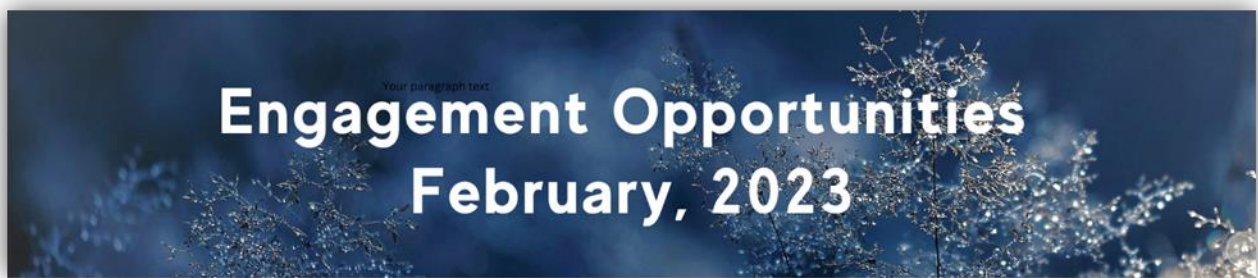

### The Land of the Patuxet

This map was drawn by Samuel de Champlain in 1605 when his ship anchored in the bay, now called Plymouth Bay. The Wampanoag Patuxet lived along this bay. Patuxet means the land of little falls, as the rivers then had many falls, where there were large herring runs.

The map shows their homes, called Wetos, fields of corn, beans and squash, and Patuxet men fishing along the shores and paddling dug-out canoes. They grew their crops by planting fish in a small circle, above which they planted their seeds. The squash grew up the corn and the beans grew outward to protect the soil from weeds. Boys stopped animals from eating the fish and crops.

By 1619, the Wampanoag Patuxet had all died from a plague that was brought here by Europeans, either sailors or explorers. When the Pilgrims arrived, they found the bones of many of the Patuxet and the remains of their villages.

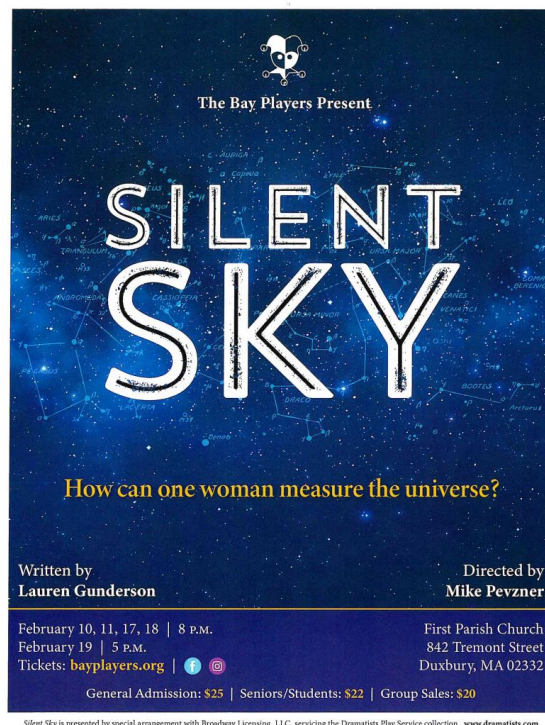
**Cedar Hill Retreat Presents**

Greg has been an avid SCUBA diver and underwater photographer since 1978. His most recent book, *The Shark Handbook*, is a must buy for all shark enthusiasts. He is a Boston Sea Rover and a member of The Explorers Club; his home and laboratory are on the south coast of Massachusetts.
