Dear Friends,

As I move closer to the end of my career in parish ministry (I plan to continue with chaplaincy, but doubt I will ever serve a parish again!), I've been thinking about what it was that called me to parish ministry over twenty years ago...The answer that comes to me is clear: **for me it's been all about building Beloved Community...**

March is "Pledge Month" and we each pledge our time, treasure and talents to keep this amazing Beloved Community at FPC alive and thriving.

Being part of a Beloved Community, a term coined by Martin Luther King Jr., can have many benefits. Here are some of them:

Sense of Belonging: Being part of our Beloved Community gives you a sense of belonging, a feeling of being connected to something larger than yourself.

Support Network: One of the things we do *best* here at FPC is to take good care of each other, providing support in times of need.

Shared Goals and Values: Our Beloved Community shares values, purpose and goals, such as working towards social justice, environmental sustainability, or spiritual growth. Working towards these goals with others who share similar values can provide a sense of meaning and purpose, and a sense of accomplishment when progress is made.

Personal Growth: Being part of a Beloved Community can provide opportunities for personal growth and development. *We may be challenged to step out of their comfort zones, learn new skills, or take on leadership roles. This can lead to increased self-confidence, self-awareness, and a sense of achievement.*

My spiritual friends, the community you find here at First Parish Church is like any other "community" you will know in your life. Family, friends and neighbors are important in our lives, *but belonging to a Beloved Community as special as we all share in such a gift!*

GOVERNING BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This month, after meetings and conversation with the congregation, the Governing Board made the decision to extend our hospitality to the Afghan family who are residing in our parsonage to stay until June 30, 2024. It had become apparent that the family, who came to us with no English and illiterate in their own language, were just not ready for more independence. The Duxbury Afghan Refugee Initiative (DARI) will be working very hard with the family over the next 15 months to help them become ready for an independent life here in the US. My greatest thanks to Meredith Lehman and Kathy Bray for their continued weekly work with the family and to all the First Parish folks who continue to work with them. They still have so many needs and if there is anyone who is interested in joining in the fun - babysitting, rides, etc please contact me. I also want to thank DARI for their donation next year of \$12,000 to help defray the costs of the parsonage. An additional \$12,000 will likely come from our cell program reserve fund.

In other very important news, the Governing Board voted last week in favor of a two year interim ministry as suggested by Rev Keith Kron of the UUA. We are excited about the prospect and about the congregation's role in continuing to make our church a welcoming and engaging place to be. We appointed an interim search committee consisting of Regina Mortland, Donna Savicki, Ted Lillys, Emily Simeone, and Lily Leedom. They will begin their work soon and we should know who our interim will be by the end of May (maybe before!)

We are planning an after church informational session on MARCH 12 - with a light lunch and childcare - to discuss the UUA article 2 initiative which is the article re-writing our principles and purposes. This is really important business for us. If you want to attend and you want child care, please let me know.

You will have the opportunity to vote on Article 2 at General Assembly if you want to go. This is an EXCELLENT experience in person. This year GA is in Pittsburgh - easily accessible by train or plane. The church will pay your \$500 registration fee. We have 6 delegate slots. There is also the possibility of attending virtually (registration would still be paid) and you would still have the opportunity of voting. I have gone virtually the last two years and it is ok, but nothing compared to being there in person and joining in with thousands of other UU's in singing. It would be wonderful to fill all 6 delegate slots for voting on this and other important issues to our denomination.

Tracy Wagner and I met with the Finance Group again and have been discussing such matters as the pledge drive, how we are going to cover our budget deficit, defraying cost of parsonage, reforming the finance "groups" into a Finance Group. We are taking a look at our budget and seeing where we can cut costs so we don't continue to go forward with deficit budgets.

We re-formed our By-Laws Committee to look at a couple of issues surrounding committees. Thank you to Bob Clark, Jeanne McKinney, Amy Hamilton and Jim Hamilton.

This month our theme centers on **VULNERABILITY** – that dreadful feeling we all get when *we perceive ourselves to be susceptible to emotional or physical harm. Some think that being vulnerable is a sign of weakness, but* Brené Brown, a prominent researcher who has spent a decade studying vulnerability, says that it is the birthplace of everything—of innovation, creativity, and change, and argues that your greatest moments were likely born from your bravest vulnerability. So being vulnerable has a silver lining – and this insight will frame our work with the kids throughout the coming month.

In RE we will explore the challenges and paths of **VULNERABILITY**. Each path includes an exploration of a moment of vulnerability. Our aim is to explore four key moments when life asks us all, especially our kids, to risk being vulnerable to gain something important, e.g., a friend, help, faith, and self-worth. Each path includes a statement that expresses how we are being asked to be vulnerable. We'll explore these key moments with a lesson a week outlined below.

Week 1: When We Seek Friendship (On the ability to say, “I like you.”) Week 2: When We Can’t Do It On Our Own (On the ability to say “I need help.”) Week 3: When We Hope (On the ability to say “I trust it will happen.”) Week 4: When We Show Our True Selves (On the ability to say “This is me.”)

With the younger kids we'll be introducing vulnerability as a “leap of faith”, and we'll be using a stuffed frog to anchor our explorations of what it means to be vulnerable. We are hoping that kids will find that using the frog as a tangible “leaper” will help them connect with this complex theme.



We are kicking off the month with an amazing multigenerational event, our Purim Costume Party and Square Dance! So, what is Purim? It is a Jewish [festival commemorating](#) the survival of the Jews who, in the 5th century BCE, were marked for death by their Persian rulers. The story is related in the [biblical Book of Esther](#) and its main theme is about triumphing over adversity. Along with our friends from Shirat Hayam, we're hosting a FUN FRIDAY event with a wonderful FREE meal, activities, prizes for best costume and a square dance party! Hope to see you on **FRIDAY, March 3rd from 5–7pm**. Fun for the whole family



LGBT ASYLUM TASK FORCE

We are pleased to have as our **March 5th Share the Plate recipient, the LGBT Asylum Task Force**, a church ministry out of Worcester, MA. They were formed in 2008 to welcome LGBT asylum seekers of all faiths, as they arrive in the US.

It is the Task Force's mission to provide comprehensive support for the 2 year period when they are prohibited from working. This includes housing, food, and connections to legal, medical and mental health resources at other local agencies.

In the last year, there has been a 50% growth in clients in Task Force housing, thus a greater need for both human and financial resources. Your support will help put our UU principles into action. This program was nominated by Cindy Wilson.

If you are aware of a nonprofit organization whose mission aligns with our UU principles, and provides direct support to their clients, they may be eligible for a Share the Plate collection. 


Summer Fair 2023 **Saturday June 17th!!!**

"Living with Sharks" with Dr. Greg Skomal

Mark your calendars! Cedar Hill Retreat Center of Duxbury, MA is pleased to announce that Dr Greg Skomal will speak on **"Living with Sharks," Friday March 10, 2023, from 7-9 PM, at First Parish Church Duxbury, 842 Tremont Street (Rt. 3a)**. He will also be available immediately following his presentation to autograph his books, *The Shark Handbook* (\$20.00), which will be available for purchase onsite.

Dr. Skomal is an accomplished marine biologist, underwater explorer, filmmaker, photographer, and author. He has been a fisheries scientist with the Massachusetts Division of Marine Fisheries since 1987, and currently heads up the Massachusetts Shark Research Program.

Greg has been an avid SCUBA diver and underwater photographer since 1978. He has written dozens of scientific research papers and has appeared in a number of film and television documentaries, including programs for National Geographic, Discovery Channel, BBC, and numerous television networks. His most recent book, *The Shark Handbook*, is a must buy for all shark enthusiasts. He is a Boston Sea Rover and a member of The Explorers Club; his home and laboratory are on the south coast of Massachusetts.
