Probably the most important thing this past month is that we started planning for events to celebrate Catherine's farewell. Please leave June 11, morning and afternoon, OPEN. We will also have a lot of "end of" things on Catherine's last Sunday, June 18.

Tracy and I are continuing to meet with the Finance people to provide frank and open discussion amongst the money people. We are considering a By-Law change that would get rid of a separate Finance Committee and institute a Finance Group made up of all the treasurers and others who have a money role in the church. One of our biggest accomplishments this month was to discuss how to fund our budget deficit. We propose using the general funds which would take just a bit from across the board.

A few weeks ago we had a very successful informational meeting and discussion of the UUA Article 2 proposed changes to our Principles and Purposes. April means the arrival of Spring, and the warmer weather means we'll be able to get outside for some of our activities this month. Our kids LOVE getting outside to play in the playground and to climb the huge tree.

This month our theme centers on Resistance – and throughout the month we will explore the challenges and paths of *resistance*. Each path includes an exploration of a practice of resistance, and each path is connected to and rooted in a religious or secular holiday. Our aim is to learn about the holiday through its relationship to our theme of Resistance. This lens will allow our kids to begin to hear the words associated with the various faiths and their holidays as well as think about how the path of resistance applies to their own life. We will focus on Vesek (also known as Buddha's birthday or Buddha Day) Earth Day and Ramadan.

Our 4th-6th OWL class graders is going well – our young youth are coming together as a group and learning about important developmental issues, both physical and psychological. We gratefully acknowledge the Patuxet Wampanoag People on whose ancestral lands we gather today. We commit to support and honor their history and culture.


Long Land Acknowledgement
