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### A MESSAGE FROM YOUR INTERIM MINISTER...

Some of the most purely joyful moments in my childhood came when I rode the waves with my father. After my grandparents moved from Tennessee to Tampa, Florida, we used free passes my father earned as a brakeman for Southern Railways to take the train to Florida, usually in the heat of summer. During a visit we would end up at Clearwater Beach, and my father would take me out to hit the waves.

I don't know how, or even whether, he taught me to quit fighting the water and instead to let it hold up me. It's a body and mind lesson I think about often these days. In such tense and demanding times, how do we let the world hold us instead of fighting to stay up? I don't know. There are things we must fight, energy and courage we must exert. Somehow in the process, though, we need to let ourselves ride the moments of beauty and solidarity and companionship that keep our heads above water.

One thing is for sure. I would never have gone out into the ocean by myself. We need each other to stay afloat. We need to be each other's lifeguards. We need to be together.

# A Winter Update from Your Ministerial Search Committee

January was a very busy month for your Ministerial Search committee! On January 2nd, the UUA began releasing to us (confidentially) the names of the ministers who are interested in applying to be our next settled minister. We received a healthy number of applicants (nine in all) and ended up Zoom interviewing six of them. The quality of the candidates is excellent and we had our work cut out for us to winnow that number down to the three ministers who we have invited to come to Duxbury to meet with the Ministerial Search committee.

Each "pre-candidate" will visit Duxbury on a weekend in February or March that fits their schedule. As we meet with them individually, we will get to know these ministers and will show them around the church and the community. You won't meet them at that time but after these extensive in-person interviews, the Ministerial Search committee will invite one of the three pre-candidates to be our final candidate. Assuming that this person accepts our offer, this minister will come to First Parish for what is known as Candidating Week, which will happen at the end of April/beginning of May. Please be sure to mark your calendars for Sunday April 27th and Sunday May 4th. The candidate will preach those two Sundays, and during that week will spend time with committees and staff, meet members and friends, and explore the area. At the end of that week, church members will vote on whether to offer that candidate the position. If it is a strong vote in favor, then the candidate will decide whether to accept the call to be our next settled minister.


